Campaign Disclosure Review /Audits	Audits of the Form 700s were completed with no surprises. We found very few reports of gifts. Individuals seemed to report gifts under the \$50 limit so we are going to expand education in this area. Campaign disclosure audits begin next quarter.
Education Outreach	External education outreach has restarted. A ses- sion with the League of Women's Voters was moved up to June and was very well attended. The presentation surrounded the Office, its func- tion and how it works today after 6 years in exist- ence.

Lobbyist Registration	As of June 30th, active lobbyist registrations re- mained stable and revenue has not increased from the \$4,225 fees for 2023.
Finance and Budget	Budget is stable as CEO Budget is supporting the additional funds needed to cover operating in- creases. The 2023-2024 saw a slight increase in the operating budget provided to the Office to cover increased costs.
Complaint/Advice Program	Two complaints were logged in the second quar- ter. One was not within jurisdiction and the other did not warrant a Notice of Violation. The advice program is consistently getting questions related to election cycles and campaign contribution lim- its.
